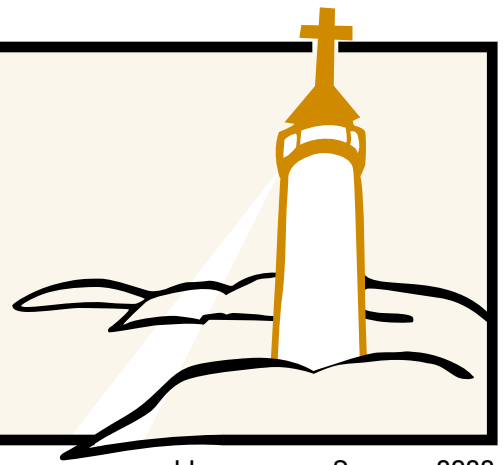

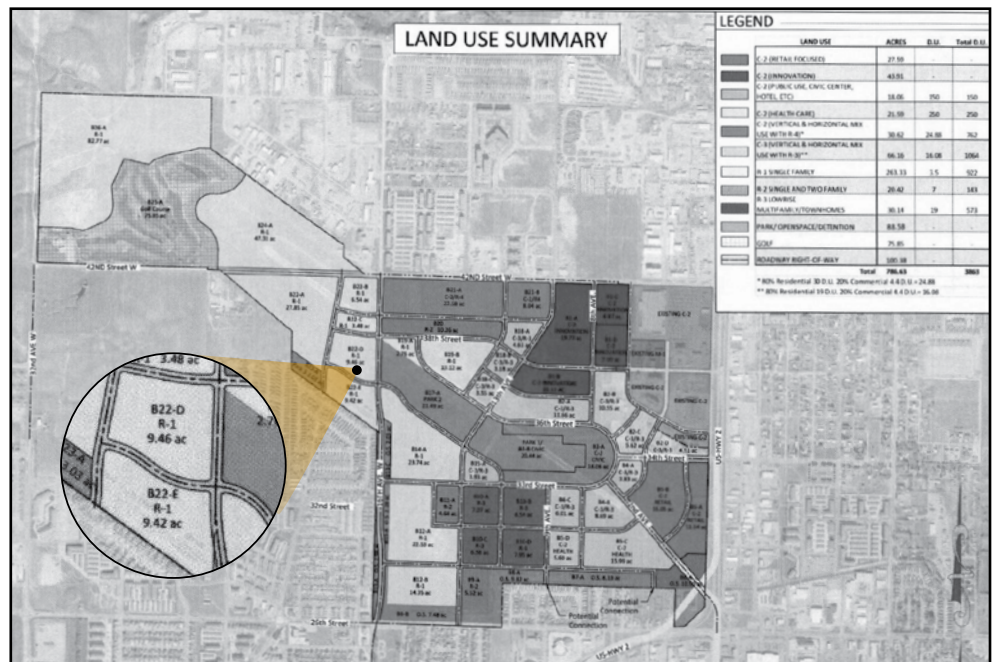

The City of Williston and Bethel Lutheran Nursing and Rehabilitation Center are pleased to announce an agreement for Bethel to purchase an 18.88-acre parcel located within the Williston Square Subdivision. Plans for a new skilled and basic care facility at Williston Square are in the design phase and groundbreaking will be announced later.

"We are very excited to move forward with the building of a new facility. Bethel is committed to providing high-quality care in Williston," said Aaron Schmit, President of the Bethel Board of Directors. "A new modern and homelike facility will allow Bethel to better serve our residents and their families, our employees, and our region, for future generations. We would like to thank the greater Williston community, our employees, our member churches, and the residents and their families we have served for 70 years of support." "Williston is where it is today because of the contributions made by the generations before us. We owe our seniors for all they have done for this community," said Williston Mayor Howard Klug. "The new Bethel facility at Williston Square will provide enhanced care for our seniors close to their friends and families. The city is honored to partner with Bethel on this project at Williston Square."

Although much work still needs to be accomplished before construction can begin, securing the future building site is a really good start. Bethel has explored various prospective sites over the course of the last several years and feels this site best fits its future needs. Bethel's Building Committee will be meeting soon with EAPC Architects to begin the planning and design phase as well as securing updated cost estimates for the project.

Of concern for all involved are the current supply chain issues and its affect on construction costs and the current inflationary price increases. We can only control what we can and we will move forward with a prudent plan. A project this size will have to rely on community and donor support as well as a bond issue to finance the remaining building costs. This will be undoubtedly the largest financial undertaking in Bethel's 74-year history.

There have been many upgrades and additions built on our existing campus; however, the facility is aging past the point of face-lifting and a new facility is needed to continue our long history of providing quality compassionate care to Williston's future generations. The delivery of care has changed immensely and so have the expectations of our residents and their families. Your gifts to Bethel's Building Fund will allow Bethel to continue this legacy. 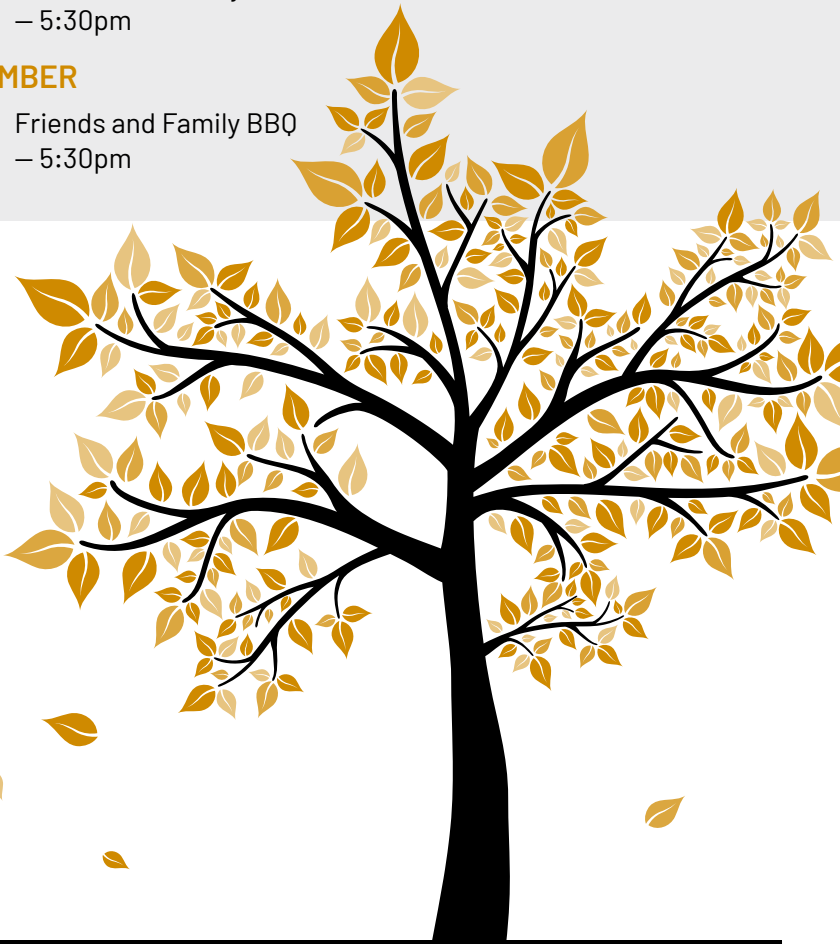

We are continuing to make great strides in staffing; within the last two months we have hired 24 of our own certified nurse assistants and three LPN/RN's! The department managers and Human Resources are continuing to work hard to add to the department teams! In addition, I am so excited to be in the finalizing stages of the nurse scholarship program where we will be able to support the career advancement of our nursing staff! This will be in collaboration with Williston State College.

50 Years of Dedication

Verna Nicks, who is turning 91 in just a couple of weeks, has dedicated her life to helping the residents at Bethel Lutheran Home in Williston. Starting in August of 1975, Nicks spends at least three to four days working in the laundry department, acting as the only on-staff seamstress, and documenting new residents' items. "I just heard there was a position open in laundry and decided to go back to work. My kids were all off and graduated..." Nicks said about finding the job opening almost 47 years ago. After being hired on, Nicks spent 25 years as a laundry washer and then retired. It wasn't long before Nicks' supervisor called her and asked if she would be willing to come back to work.

"I think she might be here longer than I will be" said Joan Tofte, Nicks' supervisor. Tofte was hired at Bethel about 25 years ago and explained that Nicks really helped her acclimate to the position. Describing Nicks as an exemplary worker who always shows up for work and willing to pick up extra shifts when needed, Tofte said Nicks is a "blessing to Bethel."

Every shift, Nicks' daughter or grandkids pick her up from home to get to work, because Nicks doesn't drive. Using a walker and other mobility aids to get around, Nicks never lets that slow her down. "She can keep up with everybody!" said Tofte. Tofte explained that not only does Nicks show up, but

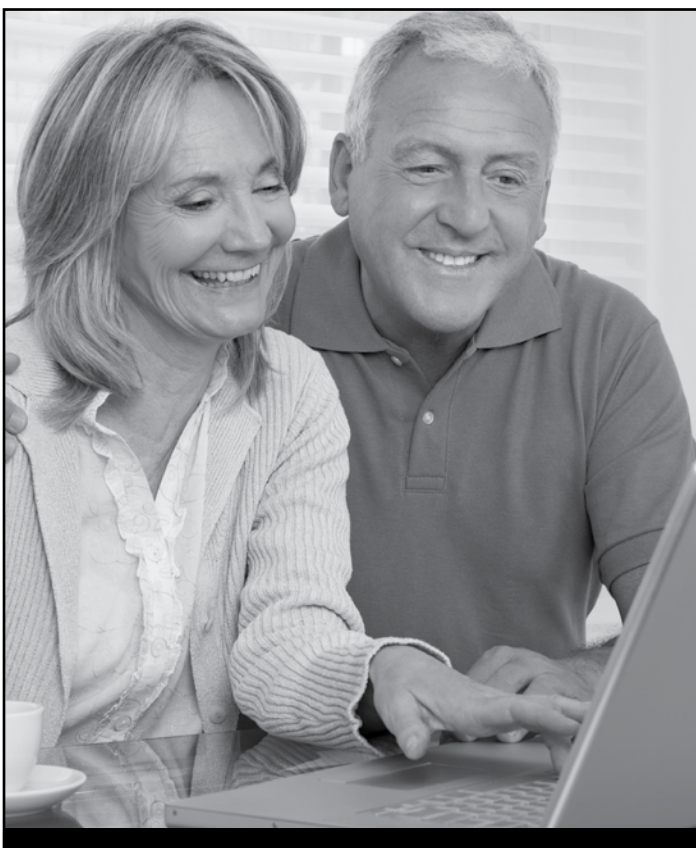
when she is on-duty, there is a high bar to be met. "She's the only one who likes to iron, and if another staff member wants to just hang the clothes up and send them that way, Verna will stop them and say, 'We don't send that up like that!'" said Tofte.

Nicks' favorite part of the job is the relationship-building she gets to do with residents and other staff members. Nicks explained that the people at Bethel really became family to her. She even makes sure everyone feels special on their birthday, making sure there is always a cake to celebrate. "It's made life more interesting, and I always have friends." said Nicks.

Outside of work, Nicks enjoys spending time with her grandkids and great-grandchild. She also enjoys knitting, sewing, coloring, and completing word finds. "I don't have to work; I just love to work. Maybe when I'm 100 I'll retire," said Nicks.

NUTRITION TIP

Greek Salad



INGREDIENTS

Dressing

- ¼ cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 3 tbsps red wine vinegar
- 1 garlic clove, *minced*
- ½ tsp dried oregano, more for sprinkling
- ¼ teaspoon Dijon mustard
- ¼ teaspoon sea salt
- Freshly ground black pepper

For the Salad

- 1 English cucumber, *cut lengthwise, seeded, and sliced ¼-inch thick*
- 1 green bell pepper, chopped into 1-inch pieces
- 2 cups halved cherry tomatoes
- 5 ounces feta cheese, *cut into ½ inch cubes**
- ⅓ cup thinly sliced red onion
- ⅓ cup *pitted Kalamata olives*
- ⅓ cup *fresh mint leaves*

DIRECTIONS

1. Make the dressing: In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, vinegar, garlic, oregano, mustard, salt, and several grinds of pepper.

2. On a large platter, arrange the cucumber, green pepper, cherry tomatoes, feta cheese, red onions, and olives. Drizzle with the dressing and very gently toss. Sprinkle with a few generous pinches of oregano and top with the mint leaves. Season to taste and serve.

GIFTS OF CASH: The easiest way to obtain a charitable deduction is to support Bethel through a cash gift. If you itemize, your gift may be fully deductible.

BEQUEST/WILL: Consider naming Bethel in your will for any fixed or proportionate share of your estate.

GIFTS OF APPRECIATED STOCKS/BONDS: Giving long-term appreciated stocks or bonds avoids capital gains tax and you will receive an immediate tax deduction based on the full fair market value on the date of the transfer.

GIFTS OF LIFE INSURANCE: Designating Bethel Lutheran Foundation as the owner and beneficiary of an existing or new insurance policy usually offers a tax advantage in the year the gift was made. If the policy is paid up, the charitable deduction will be the cash value at the time of the gift. If the policy is not paid up, you continue to pay annual premiums which will become tax deductible to you each year.

GIFTS OF REAL ESTATE: If you have owned rental property, farmland or other real estate for many years, a charitable gift of that property can be especially tax advantageous. If sold outright, the sale could result in capital gains on any appreciation, and ordinary income on any depreciation recaptured. A charitable gift to Bethel may avoid the tax consequence and realize a charitable deduction for the full market value of the real estate.

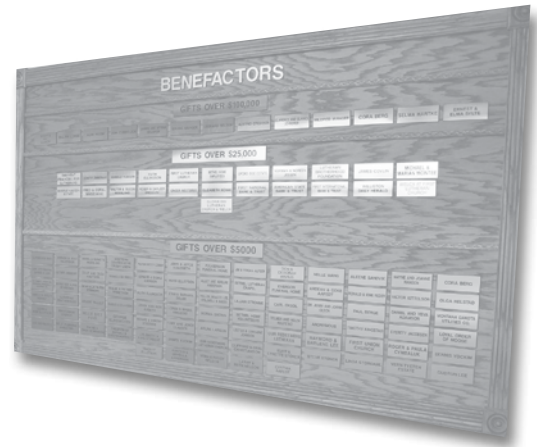
