Just Breathe

In frontier areas like Richland County, fire departments are staffed by volunteers that are on call every minute of everyday. When the siren blares, crews of dedicated men and women rush to the fire hall to jump on a fire truck to save crops, homes, businesses, and most importantly, people. They risk their own health and wellbeing for others. That's a mighty sacrifice!

When the Sidney Volunteer Fire Department requested funding to upgrade their SCBA (Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus) air compressor, the Foundation was honored to help out. "With this upgraded compressor, we now have lighter, smaller tanks to carry on our backs. It takes half the time it used to filling the air tanks and they hold twice as much compressed air". Sidney Volunteer Fire Chief, Adam Smith, commented. When an enclosed fire happens, it is critical that firefighters have air masks and air tanks while they extinguish the flames. "When you walk into a structure fire, it can get up to 700 or 800 degrees. Without the proper equipment we would be defenseless against large fires" said Smith.

During my visit with Adam and Assistant Fire Chief Kale Rasmussen, I learned that just last year the Sidney Volunteer Fire Department was called out 200 times. Of those 200 calls, 75 were fires and 35 of those were enclosed structures. There are 27 volunteer firefighters that have answered these calls for assistance in car accidents, fires, and other emergent situations. They would love to welcome some new members. Kale demonstrated how the tanks are filled and explained all the pressure gauges and why they are important. When the compressor kicked on, I felt like I was back in my Dad's garage. Kale mentioned that he supports the Foundation because of all the good it does for our community.

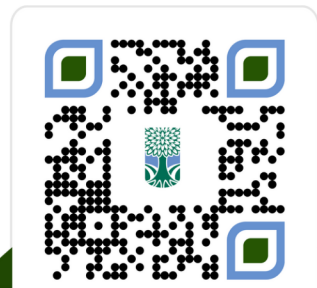

Jenna Wheeler: Lifetime Learner

It was 2009 when Jenna Wheeler returned home to be closer to family after earning her LPN (Licensed Practical Nurse) at M State in Moorhead, MN. She began her nursing career at Sidney Health Center's Extended Care before moving on to the Obstetrics Clinic.

"When the OB doc that I was working with decided to move on, I joined the Waiver Program, a home visiting program where a social worker and I would meet with patients in the area and assess if they were eligible for further services, like adding a wheelchair ramp, or if we could arrange for more outings for the patient. We traveled to Plentywood, Bainville, Glendive, Brockton, Poplar, Wolf Point, and many more places", Jenna remembered. "The work was rewarding but taxing sometimes."

When the grant funding expired for the Waiver program, Jenna worked in Health Information Systems as a Clinical Documentation Improvement Specialist. After a year there, she became Sidney Health Center's Clinic Nursing Supervisor, but something was missing. An opportunity opened up at the Cancer Care Center, and Jenna went for it. "Interacting with patients is what I feel I was meant to do. That's why I decided to go back to school to get my BSN (Bachelor of Science in Nursing). This degree will allow me to help infusion patients directly. Direct patient care is my goal now. The Medical Oncology patients are so kind and appreciative of the care they receive. They are so positive even when it's hard to be. They are the ones who inspired me to further my education", she explained.

Jenna received a Healthcare Scholarship from the Foundation for Community Care to help her attain her goal. She began her online training through North Dakota State University in the fall of 2022 and will finish in December of 2024 after 6 weeks of clinicals in Fargo. Jenna Wheeler is quite an asset to Sidney Health Center and to our community. She displays loyalty, commitment, flexibility, and excellence. The Foundation is so proud to have played a part in her story!

A few years back, I had the honor of interviewing John Olson in his office at Blue Rock headquarters in Sidney, Montana. He was the kind of man that made me nervous at first, but once the ice was broken, the conversation was immersive. Because I had worked at the Foundation for Community Care for so many years, of course I had met and exchanged pleasantries with him before, but this meeting was different. I remember his voice was deep and calming while we talked about how it all began.



JOHN OLSON
Founding Father of the Foundation

John L. Olson's story was one of inspiration, determination, hard work, and success. His modest beginnings at his uncle's bottling plant in Fairview ignited the passion John had for Pepsi and the companies he built, Blue Rock Products and Blue Rock Distributing. Being an employer for more than 50 years brought a responsibility that John didn't shy away from. He always believed that he needed to do his part to ensure that his employees had the best schools to educate their children and the highest quality healthcare available and accessible.

Giving back to the community was something John was no stranger to. He served on the MDU Resources board for almost 25 years, was on the Blue Cross/Blue Shield board for 10 years and was chairman of the Montana Bottlers Association for several years. In 1971, he was Sidney Chamber of Commerce president. After co-founding the Foundation for Community Care, he served as not only chairman, but as a board member for more than 2 decades.

Though John Olson left this world in August of 2022, he also left a legacy of faithfulness, family, and philanthropy—a true community champion and lover of all things Montana.
