





The Amerada Petroleum Company had been trying for months, when they finally struck black gold in the wee early morning hours of April 4, 1951. The discovery forever changed Tioga and the state of North Dakota. Following the discovery, millions of acres of land became leased and families packed up their campers and moved into town by the hundreds. 
